During the pandemic child abuse and neglect have been on the rise. Children too often pay a heavy price when families are under increased financial stress.

There has been a surge in the number of child abuse and neglect cases in the courts. CASA programs across Nebraska are working hard to ensure these children don't go unnoticed.

This year volunteers have visited children online, read them stories, sent them songs, celebrated birthdays and holidays, ensuring children never feel alone. Our volunteers make a real difference in children's lives. CASA volunteers are needed now to meet our goal of serving every child in the system.



State of Nebraska CASA 2020

- **908 Volunteers served 2,108 abused and neglected children.**
- **Volunteers shared 37,575 hours of their time and traveled 100,000 miles**
- **248 NEW volunteers were recruited, screened, trained and sworn in by a judge.**
- **20 CASA programs served 52 Counties**
- **CASA programs in Nebraska now serve 82% more children with 120% more volunteers than 10 years ago; and still more than 1,300 children in Nebraska are in the Foster Care system without a CASA.**



From the desk of Dan

I want to share a story about Ms. Griffin, a fourth grade teacher I had over 57 years ago. Ms. Griffin planted a seed that would not blossom for 50 years. Ms. Griffin was a big fan of famous writer Willa Cather. Ms. Cather won a Pulitzer Prize for one of her works in the 1920's and was a gifted novelist who wrote about life on the Nebraska prairie. As a fourth grader I had no interest in Willa Cather and did not understand Ms. Griffin's passion for this famous writer or the constant references to her work. I could have cared less. Then, several years ago, my wife was featured in an art show at the Willa Cather Center in Red Cloud. I accompanied my wife to her show's opening night. Since I'd seen all of her paintings I wandered into the Willa Cather resource center at one point and found myself scanning a couple Willa Cather books. Unexpectedly, I ended up purchasing one by the end of the evening. I later found myself with a high regard for her writings. Not only would I have never believed I would end up a fan of Willa Cather, but Ms. Griffin would most likely have rolled over in her grave at the notion Dan Scarborough had developed an interest in Willa Cather after so many years of disinterest. I am highly grateful for Ms. Griffin's influence on me and the gift she gave me which would not be appreciated for many years.



What does this have to do with CASA? – Everything. Several of our CASA volunteers are, or have been, teachers. My story does not only apply to teachers, but also to those who volunteer and provide care, concern and advocacy for children. The gifts they provide may not be readily accepted or appreciated in real time, however, there is always a possibility at some point they will make a difference.
