Trouble at home can mean trouble in school. But children with CASA volunteers are more likely to pass their classes, and are less likely to misbehave or get kicked out.



Did you know?

According to CASAforChildren.org, children without a CASA volunteer spend 8 months longer in foster care than children who have a CASA volunteer.



CASA volunteers check on the children they serve more frequently than the paid Guardian ad Litem (attorney) who represents the children in court. This translates to better outcomes for the children and more services for the children while they are in foster care.
